At the beginning of academic year, academic calendar of the Examination committee including continuous internal assessment, form filling dates, practical examination dates etc. is prepared and displayed on institutional websites. As the commencement of regular classes, respective teachers create awareness among the students about semester pattern & assessment process. Advertisement Expenses Affiliation fees, Computer Software fees and Garden expenses, Laboratory Current Expenses, College Magazine Expenses, Staff Training and Faculty Development Expenses, Newspapers and periodicals Salary to visiting staff Supervision and service charges Telephone expenses Printing and Stationary Salary and Allowances Student Expenses Miscellaneous expenses The procedure for expenditure of funds reflects transparency. Institute sticks on the utilization of budget approved for academic and administrative expenses by the governing body. After getting the final approval of the budget from the governing body, the purchase process is initiated. The quotations are called and with the consent of respective HoDs, after negotiations the purchase orders are placed by the purchase department of PRES. The payment is released after delivery of the respective goods as per the terms and conditions placed in the purchase order. All the financial transactions are transparent through vouchers and bills. The payment is passed after checking and verification of items. All the party payments are made through bank. The concerned faculties members ensure that the received material with correct specifications mentioned in the purchase order are purchased. There is a system of internal and external financial audit. There is a regular practice of conducting internal and external financial audit. Internal audit is done by the internal auditor nominated by the Institution. Internal auditors carry out thorough checking and verification of all the vouchers of the transactions quarterly. The statements of expenditure and utilization certificates are audited by the external auditor. The settlement of the accounts is done by the concerned funding agencies.

3.The context:

The forest is very important for maintaining the ecological balance of the environment of the earth. Large scale deforestation is taking place in the name of modernization in recent times. Therefore, the balance of nature is deteriorating.

4.The practice: Plantation of medicinal plants is one of the important activity undertaken by the college for the society. Our Arts and Commerce and Science College started this plantation drive from the academic year 2019-2020. The tree planting program involves the students, staff of the college as well as the people of the area. The medicinal plants are being planted at Wadazari kd and Talegaon dighe barren land area of Talegaon dighe village by Botany department and N.S.S. department. The tree plantation program completed five years. In the last 05 years, 5000 forest tree and medicinal plants were planted with the help of students, staff of the college as well as people of the Talegaon dighe village. Water conservation & water harvesting our students dig contour trenches around 1 to 1.5 feet deep pits.

The Gram Panchayat of Talegaon dighe and Wadzari kd. the college to provide forest or medicinal plants every year for planting medicinal plants. The B.Sc. botany student or N.S.S. Volunteers of the college take active participation in this drive and make their valuable contribution to maintain the balance of the

environment.

- Fitness Enhancement: Provide structured physical activities such as yoga, aerobics, hiking, or strength training to improve overall fitness levels.
- Mental Health Awareness: Facilitate sessions on emotional well-being, coping strategies, and mental health resources.
- Fear in mind about health and wellness camp due to a lack of education.
- Girl students have low HB. So they are unable to donate blood. It impacts the overall collection of blood units.

4. The Practice: -

The college or any educational institute is an effective medium to inculcate awareness among the people about any social issue as it directly connects to the young generation which is the future of the country. So, we have put the first step towards social awareness like health and wellness camp. Keeping in view the aforesaid objectives and context, the college decided to take total

heath check-up like BP, ECG, Dental check-up, Blood Donation, etc. The college has been engaging in this activity for the last 5 years. Moreover, we call different blood banks to arrange the Blood Donation Camp in our college. In the camp, about 30 to 40 blood bags get collected each year. Around 80 students including staff were involved in the donation. In the end, Heath check-up of government Hospital and the blood bank doctors deliver an informative lecture on awareness about girl's health and blood donation. They provide information about a balanced diet that helps to increase the HB level. In addition to this, they also distribute iron tablets to those who suffer from low HB.

- Blood bank authority gives the card to each blood donor which helps that person in the future to get blood when needed. Many students including two faculty members got the blood for them in emergency conditions by using this certificate.
- Students and teachers get information about their HB, wellness check-up like BP, ECG etc.
- They get information on what diet to take for increasing HB.
- Social Benefits: Positive impact on participants' social well-being, including improved relationships and community involvement.

Only those who were with sound financial back ground could go for higher studies. All the rest particularly girls students were found totally deprived of pursuing higher education. Due to financial hurdles, social commutation problem, psychology insecurities almost all parents were reluctant to educate their daughter .Because of such limitation very few youth from the nearby village could take graduation programmes.

The SBVP Samaj Loknete Balasaheb Thorat Arts,Commerce and Science College Talegaon Dighe was established in 8 August 2008 by the grate vision and mission of Late Sahakar Maharshi Bhausaheb Santuji Thorat . The College is situated at Talegaon Dighe Village. When college was established number of students were hailing from extremely poor family located in drought and hilly areas. Several constrains were preventing them from idea of going for higher education .

We hope that the progressive endeavours and activities of our college will help to reduce the percentage of dependents on agricultural with better alternative vocational avenues benefiting society at large. The implementation of NEP-2020 with the active support of SPPU, the faculty of the college has participated in various seminars, conference and workshop and thus research extension is justified.
